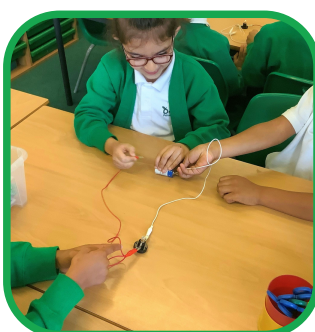
### Becoming Owl Babies

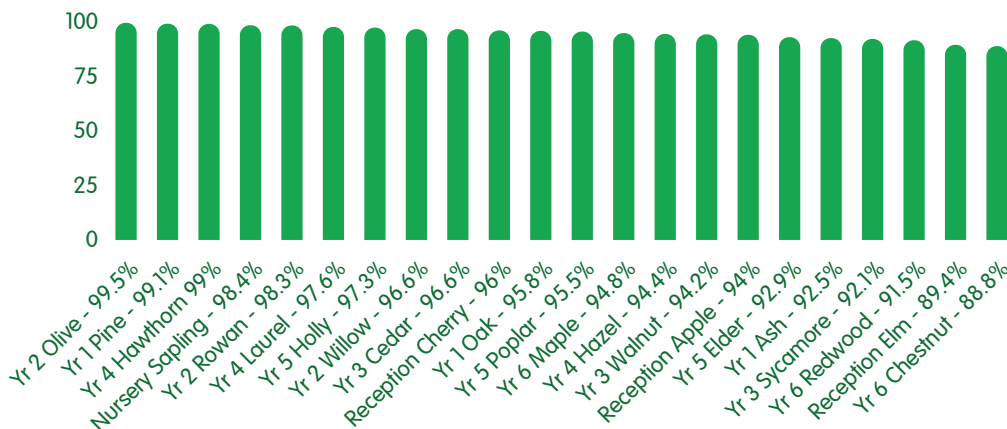
